We all Mendi people say thank you very much and I hope Great God will to bless you and keep you. Those who want hurt you and my dear friend I pray for you I love you very much and we pray to God will have mercy upon in your heart and Mendi people thank you very much and If you to love Christ and Christ will give to you a new heart and you [say] give them a good thing and I love you very much indeed I pray for you and dear friend you children been well now and I am sorry to hear your children has sick. I hope you will to make them get well and you will have mercy upon them and mendi people give much good love to you and all your families and I love you very much. This is from you Friend
