Apple iOS: App Store


Android: Google Play Store or Play Store

Windows Phone: Windows Phone Store


In the search box in the app store, type in “Hoopla Digital,” accept the terms of use, and install it.

To begin, you will need to login to Hoopla. You can do so by using an already existing Hoopla account or you can sign up for one by tapping on “Sign Up.”






# Choose Your Library



# Getting Started with Hoopla

Welcome to Hoopla! Now you can begin browsing, checking out, and streaming books, music, movies, and more! This is what the homepage looks like as well as your main menu. Clicking the “list menu” button (three horizontal lines) will open and close your list menu.

From the list menu, you can get back to Hoopla’s homepage, check your account and see titles you have checked out, and get additional help.






# Searching for Items


Searching for items is easy in Hoopla. **Tap on the magnifying glass to begin a search.** You can type in the title, author, subject, or keyword for what you are looking for to view available items.

You can also simply **browse by scrolling down the page** and viewing items by category, such as audiobooks, movies, etc. There is a “browse all” option next to each category that you can tap on.



# Viewing Your Search Results

When you make a general search, your results will be displayed similar to this. Tap on "Filter" to see items in a specific format. You can also tap "back" to go back to the last page you viewed.

# Checking Items Out

Tap on the cover of any item to be taken to its information page. Here you can read a summary of the item and even see similar titles by viewing that option towards the bottom of the page. Tap on the blue “Borrow” button to check the item out. Remember that you can only borrow 8 titles per month. The limit will be set back to 8 on the first of the month.

Want to remember a title to borrow later? Keep a favorites list by tapping the heart icon.

Favorites can be viewed in the list menu under “My Titles.”
